is a Christian Family Conference held in Llanidloes, Powys.

The conference begins with the evening meeting on Saturday 21st August (campers arriving after midday) and ends at midday on Thursday 26th August. With the afternoons free, there is plenty of time to explore this area of outstanding natural beauty.

The conference is based at St Idloes Church, which has been a site of worship since the 6th century. We have disabled access and toilets, a loop system and signing (if requested.) The conference is self catering but there will be tea/coffees/snacks available and a small bookshop. There are plenty of small cafes and restaurants locally.

The walking routes of Glyndwr's Way and the Severn Way pass near Llanidloes, as does the National Cycle Route.

Golf, Clay Pigeon Shooting and the town's Sports Centre including a swimming pool, are all situated nearby.

The campsite for the conference is at Dol-Ilys Farm which is situated within walking distance of the historic market town of Llanidloes, on the banks of the River Severn.

Facilities available on site include:

- Toilets, showers, electricity hook ups, a laundry room, a camper's kitchen for the preparation of snacks and a children's play area.
- Fishing on the Severn is also available on the site. Dogs are welcome, but must stay on a lead.

We have secured a special conference rate of £5 per person per night, £3 for under 12's.

The Rt Rev Alan Abernethy, the Bishop of Connor (Ireland) was made homeless at the age of six, through his father's gambling. This led to rejection by the church which he grew up hating and also

having profound difficulties with God. But the Spirit of the Father wooed him back to have a particular ministry to the hurt and disappointed and those who struggle with their walk with the Lord. He has a key role in restructuring ministry training in the church of Ireland and has written 'Fulfilment and frustration' and is now writing a second book on the subject of doubt.

Alan will be leading special seminars for Clergy and leaders on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons.

James Pitcher lives in Nottingham and has a pastoral role in a Christian secondary school. He has led the worship at his church and at 'Easter People', and trained worship bands. He will be leading the worship for the main morning sessions.

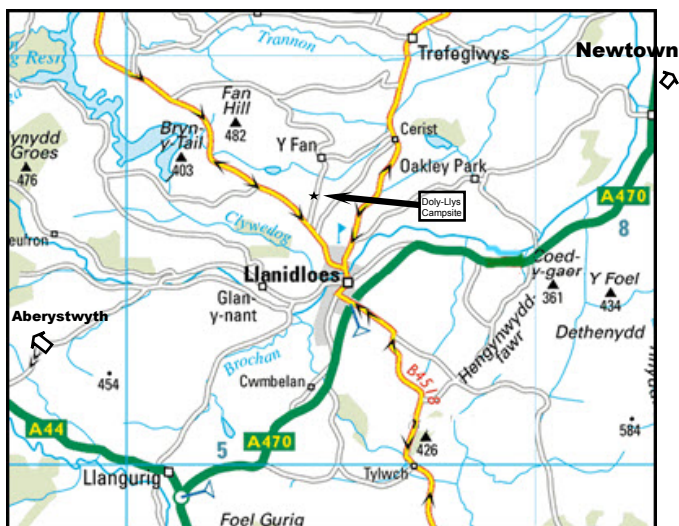
